Read Aloud Tip!

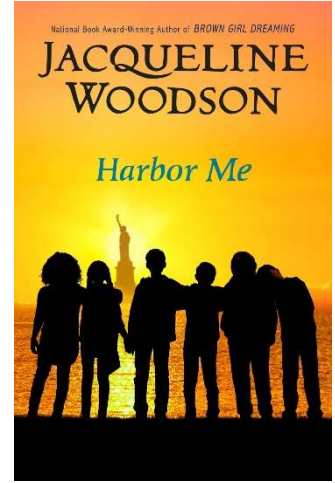

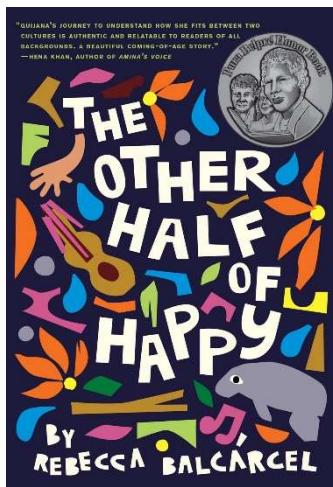

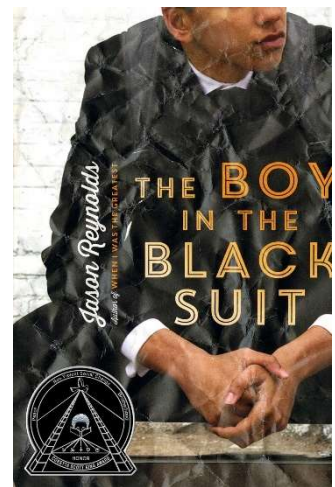
